
FUNDRAISING

But for all the lack of sleep they worked hard helping to break rocks to lay in foundations, bricked up walls in the new agriculture shed, repaired shade cloth damaged in the recent storms, filled upright metal posts with cement as well as participating in our one-on-one Reading and Conversation Programme with the students. Compared to other groups, they were here for a shorter time but packed a lot of activities into a couple of days. Thanks guys very much for all your help. We hope you left Cambodia with fond memories of Kep Gardens.

EYE CLINIC

This year we took 20 elderly members of the community to the Eye Clinic in Kampot. Two people had laser surgery on their cataracts and 8 people needed glasses which your donations to our health fund paid for. Thank you for your help.





AGRICULTURE PROGRAMME

We have been building a large shed for the Agriculture Programme which will house an area for propagating seedlings, a nursery for selling seedlings and larger plants, a tea room and a kitchen. Thank you to Mirjam, Elize and their friends for fundraising and donating the money to help build the shed. Meanwhile, Emma and Andres continue building raised beds and planting trees until the shed is finished.





The English school section of Kep Gardens is on holiday at the moment. We begin again on 2nd October with 9 classes and still we have a huge waiting list. The two morning classes though are small as they are the children who change every month from morning to afternoon school.

The Trade section is busy building the area for the agriculture programme, completing some work on a new room for a client and starting to build a house for a neighbor. Lot's to do and lots of learning.

CURRICULUM ADDITIONS

In the new school year we are planning to add environmental studies into our curriculum on a regular basis in conjunction with the Kep Government's Global Green Programme. Each class will have their own garden to work on but also a garden club learning about the environment and what they can do to make their own homes and villages environmentally friendly.

In addition, we are going to ask a local person to open a shop at Kep Gardens but the person must agree to sell mainly healthy food and use other ways to serve the drinks and food rather than plastic containers and plastic bags. In other words, a healthy canteen with the aim of showing the students and their families that it is possible to live without plastic. It will also cut down on the plastic rubbish that is brought into Kep Gardens every day that we have to dispose of.

Also thinking hard about an extra programme for some of our special ed children. We want to take them out of the classroom to do other activities, not every day, only a couple of days a week but this of course depends on volunteers as we don't want to deprive the other students of their one-on-one time with the volunteers. Also need to think of many activities for them as we are looking at 44 weeks. Still a work in progress this one. We would be grateful for any ideas.

An interesting year is coming up for the English school. Of course, we can't do all these things without your help. Any donations would be gratefully accepted.
